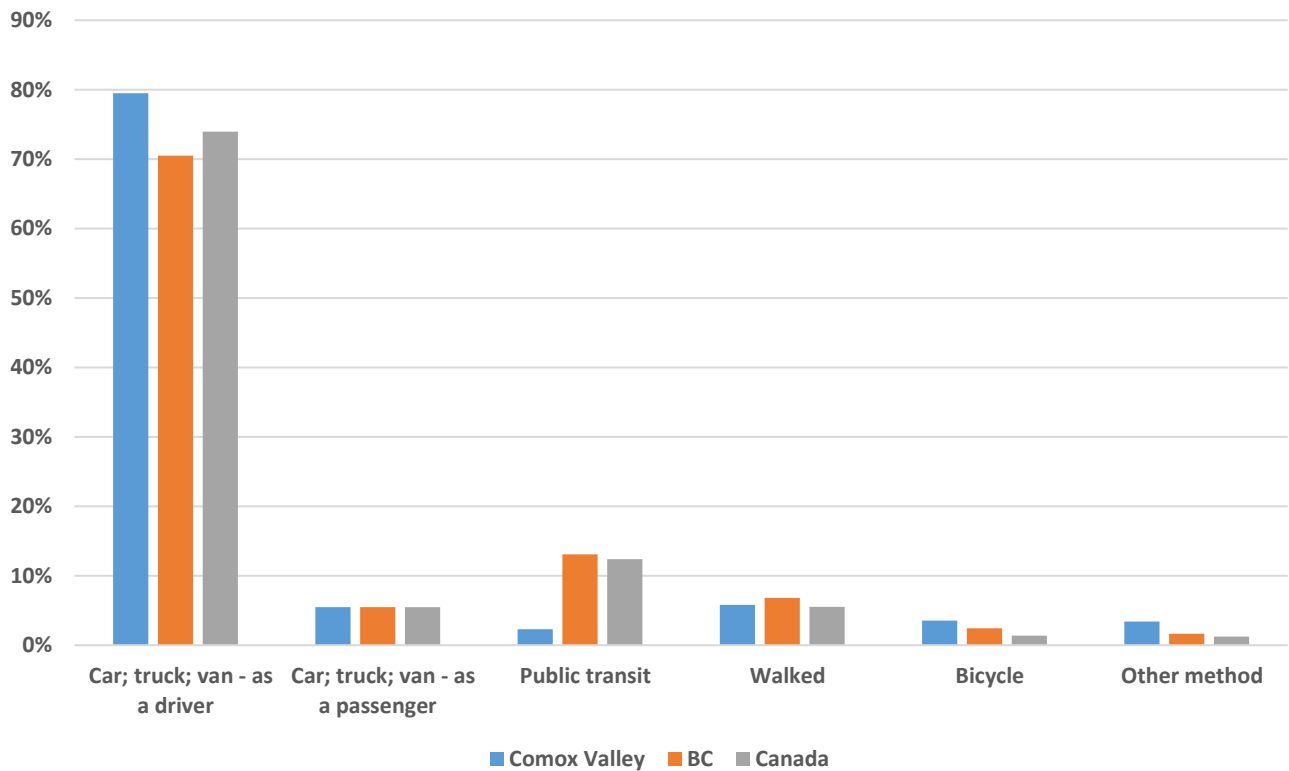


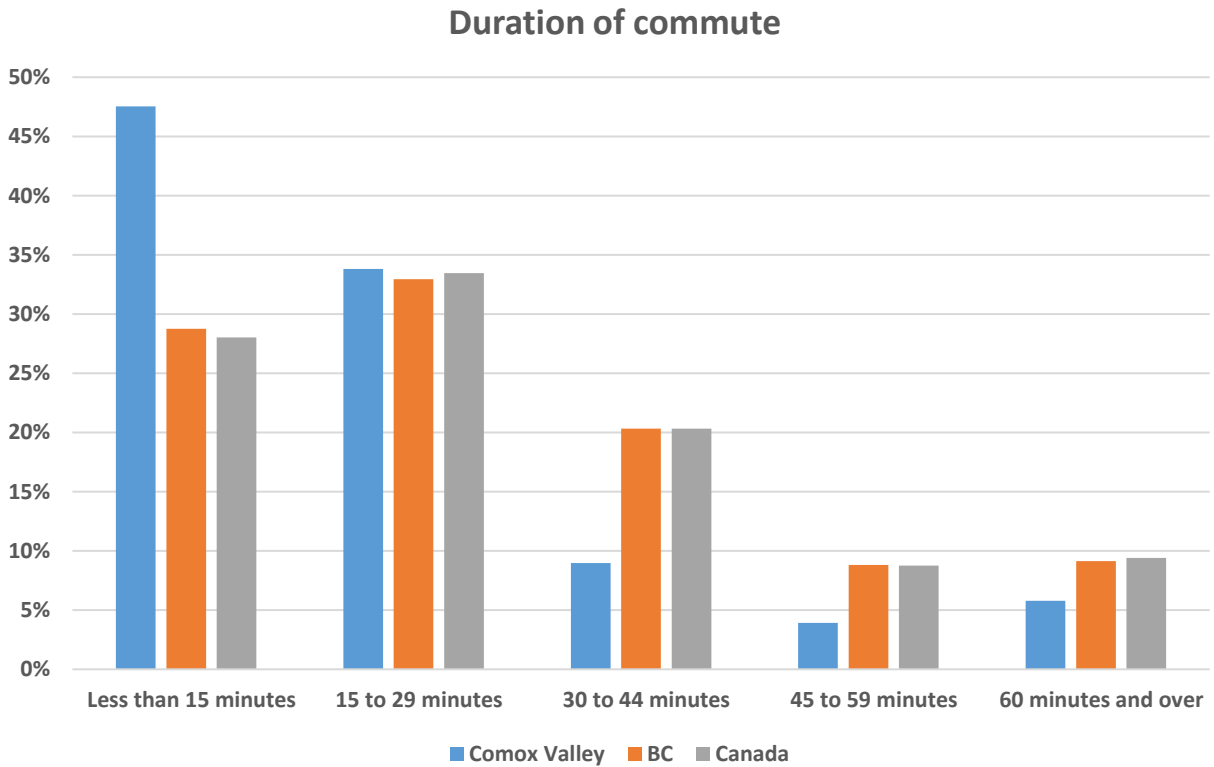
## Census Canada Journey to Work Release Highlights

Those who commuted to work in the Comox Valley were more likely to drive themselves (79.5%) than the rest of BC (70.5%) and Canada (74.0%). There was a far higher share of workers using public transit in BC (13.1%) and Canada (12.4%) than the Comox Valley (2.3%). Comox Valley residents were also slightly more likely to bike (3.6%) than BC (2.5%) or Canada (1.4%).

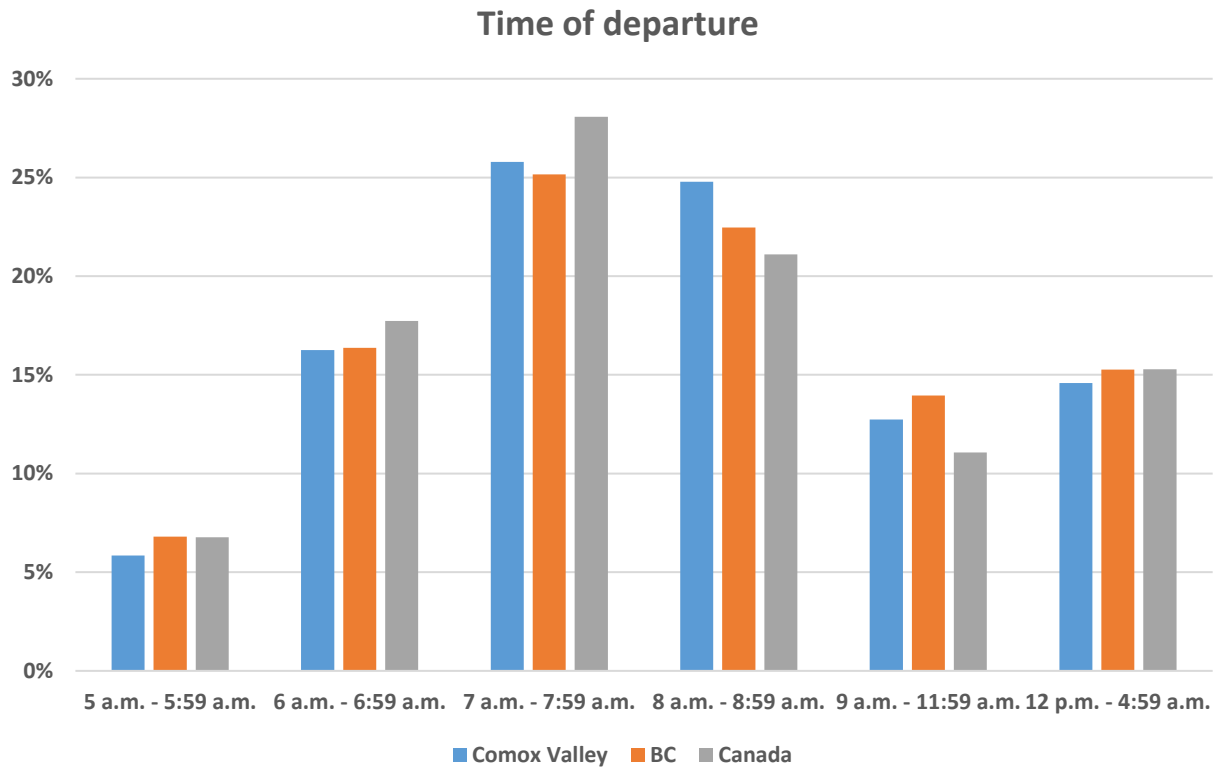
Mode of transportation



A significantly higher share of workers in the Comox Valley enjoy less than 15 minute commutes (47.5%) than BC (28.8%) and Canada (28.0%). The three are similar in the 15-29 minute group, but BC and Canada possess a higher share of workers spending 30-44, 45-59 and more than 60 minutes commuting to work.



Workers in the Comox Valley are most likely to leave for work between 7 a.m. and 7:59 a.m. (25.8%), inline with BC (25.2%) and Canada (28.1%). Canada and BC shares are higher for 5 a.m. – 5:59 a.m. departures (both 6.8%) than the Comox Valley (5.8%), while the Comox Valley has a higher share (24.8%) for 8 a.m. – 8:59 a.m. departures (BC -22.5%; Canada – 21.1%).
